At St. Joseph's Hospital, Make a Difference, where the employees get together and they bring funds together and they pick a person to be a blessing to, that's what I want to say. And one of our residents was chosen through Ms. Gorham. They contacted Ms. Gorham, and we had to think of a person that was really in need, not just to give a name just to get gifts and you're not in need, and we did have a resident that was in need. And, listen, I was overwhelmed.

On that committee, you had some lawyers, we had some, like Mr. Jones himself dealing with finance, people that work in HR Departments, and it was awesome. The person was crying. I'm not going to say the name, but one of our residents just broke down. I mean, they came in and they really provided for this resident. And I said thank you, thank you, thank you so much, because it was a great

1 | need for that person.

Also, it took us back to us, maybe we can do something like this with the employees for the Paterson Housing Authority, and also include the Commissioners, where we could just maybe put our funds in, \$5, \$10, and maybe we can pick someone, one of our residents that are in need.

So, I just want to say, Ms. Gorham, thank you, thank you, thank you so much. And then the person kept saying, "Why me? Why me? Why me?"

I said, "Because you're special, that's why you."

So thank you, I forgot all about that, Making a Difference.

EXE. DIR. GORHAM: And while you're standing also, Clara's AMP is like really hot, I guess because it's right downtown and folks are very vibrant in that AMP. Councilman Jackson called wanting to bring in food, do a pantry-type situation.

So I did see Councilman Jackson again on Friday evening, so we're going to sit down and try and coordinate. He's still planning it and flushing it out, but he's going to make food available to, not just our residents, but for seniors throughout the city at some point in time.
